# **The Artists**

## **CHARLES BARKER** conductor



Charles Barker has conducted orchestras worldwide, including the Royal Philharmonic, Paris Opéra Orchestra, Danish Radio Symphony, La Orquestra Filarmonica de Buenos Aires, Adelaide Symphony, Columbus Symphony, and the Pacific Symphony. He is currently principal conductor of American Ballet Theatre (since 1987), music director for the Pittsburgh Ballet Theatre (since 2007), and a regular guest conductor for San Francisco Ballet and Houston Ballet. In addition to his work with ABT, Mr. Barker was music director of The Australian Ballet from 1997 to 2001, when he joined The Royal Ballet in London until 2003. He was music director of the Kansas City Ballet from 1985 to 1987. From 1995 to 1998 he was a member of the Barnard-Columbia Ancient Drama Group, which presents Greek and Latin drama in the original language. In addition to being a cast member, he wrote music for *The Bacchae*, *Hippolytus*, and *Heracles*.

Mr. Barker was music director and conductor of the American Chamber Orchestra from 1981 to 1987. In February 1983 he made his Carnegie Hall debut conducting the ACO, and in November 1983 performed *A Tribute to Aaron Copland* at Carnegie Hall in honor of the composer's 83rd birthday. In 1985, he was music director for Aaron Copland's rarely performed opera *The Second Hurricane*, which played to critical acclaim at the New Federal Theatre in New York. Mr. Barker has conducted numerous film and television features for dance, including *Dance in America*, a PBS special presentation on the works of Antony Tudor; the BBC in England; TV Asahi in Japan; and the ABC in Australia.

Mr. Barker lives in New York with his wife, Miranda Coney, former principal dancer of The Australian Ballet, and their two sons.

ABT Studio Company, the junior company of American Ballet Theatre, is currently made up of 12 rising stars of the ballet world between the ages of 16 and 22. ABT Studio Company prepares these outstanding young dancers, who hail from all over the globe, to enter American Ballet Theatre or other leading ballet companies worldwide. 85% of current dancers in American Ballet Theatre are alumni of ABT Studio Company, including eight soloists and 15 principal dancers.

ABT Studio Company serves as an ambassador for American Ballet Theatre by engaging with communities in a range of venues worldwide, performing masterworks of the classical and neoclassical canons alongside contemporary and newly created works. Each season ABT Studio Company commissions new ballets from emerging and established choreographers.

## THE ORCHESTRA NOW (TON)

Founded in 2015 by Bard College and led by Leon Botstein, TŌN is a graduate program that is training the next generation of music professionals, offering a master's degree or an advanced certificate. The members of the orchestra are graduates of the world's leading conservatories, and hail from countries across North and South America, Europe, and Asia. Many have gone on to have successful careers in orchestras around the world.

TŌN performs dozens of concerts a year at venues including Carnegie Hall, Lincoln Center, The Metropolitan Museum of Art, and the Fisher Center at Bard. The orchestra has performed with numerous distinguished guest conductors and soloists, including Leonard Slatkin, Gil Shaham, Neeme Järvi, Stephanie Blythe, Fabio Luisi, Vadim Repin, Joseph Young, Peter Serkin, Naomi Woo, and JoAnn Falletta.

Among TŌN's many albums on the Hyperion, Sorel Classics, and AVIE labels are 2024's *Exodus* and *The Lost Generation*, and rare recordings of Othmar Schoeck's *Lebendig begraben* and Bristow's *Arcadian* Symphony. Recordings of TŌN's live concerts from the Fisher Center can be heard regularly on Classical WMHT-FM and WWFMThe Classical Network, and the orchestra has appeared over 100 times on *Performance Today*, broadcast nationwide.
