In his highly successful book *Jurassic Park*, author Michael Crichton enabled us to imagine what the return of the great vertebrates of 150 million years ago might be like. In his thrilling 1993 film adaptation, Steven Spielberg brought these fascinating and terrifying creatures to life, and in so doing captivated movie audiences around the world.

I must say that I greatly enjoyed the challenge of trying to tell the film's story musically. And while we can luxuriate today in the magnificent sound produced by The Orchestra Now $(T\bar{O}N)$ as they perform the entire score live to the picture, it's nevertheless tempting to imagine what the trumpeting of these great beasts of the distant past might have been like ...

I know I speak for everyone connected with the making of *Jurassic Park* in saying that we're greatly honored by this event . . . and I hope that today's audience will have some measure of the joy we experienced while making the film more than twenty years ago.

The Artists

JAMES BAGWELL conductor



James Bagwell maintains an active schedule

as a conductor of choral, orchestral, and

opera repertoire. In 2015 he was named

associate conductor of The Orchestra

Now (TŌN), and in 2009 he was appointed

principal guest conductor of the American

Symphony Orchestra (ASO), From 2009-

2015 he served as music director of The

Collegiate Chorale. Highlights with the Chorale

included conducting rarely performed operas

at Carnegie Hall, including Bellini's Beatrice

di Tenda, Rossini's Möise et Pharaon, and

Boito's Mefistofele. He conducted the

New York premiere of Philip Glass's Toltec

Symphony and Osvaldo Golijov's Oceana at

Carnegie Hall. His performance of Kurt Weill's

Knickerbocker Holiday at Alice Tully Hall was

recorded live for Gaslight Records and is

the only complete recording of the work. He

prepared the Chorale for numerous concerts

at the Verbier Festival in Switzerland and for

programs with the Israel Philharmonic in Israel

and the Salzburg Festival. He has collaborated

since 2011 with singer and composer Natalie

Merchant, conducting orchestras across the

country, including the National Symphony

Orchestra at the Kennedy Center.

In January 2025 he led a rare performance of Carl Nielson's symphony *The Inextinguishable*, and in May 2026 he will conduct Mahler's Second Symphony in celebration of the TSO's 25th anniversary season.

A noted preparer of choruses, Mr. Bagwell has trained choruses for numerous American and international orchestras, including the New York Philharmonic, Boston Symphony Orchestra, San Francisco Symphony, NHK Symphony (Japan), St. Petersburg Symphony, Budapest Festival Orchestra, Cincinnati Pops Orchestra, and Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra. As chorus master for the ASO, he has received numerous accolades for his collaborations with Leon Botstein performing rare choral works at Carnegie Hall. Since 2003 he has been director of choruses for the Bard Music Festival, conducting and preparing choral works.

Mr. Bagwell is professor of music at Bard College, director of performance studies in the Bard College Conservatory of Music, and codirector of the Graduate Conducting Program.

Mr. Bagwell is a regular guest conductor for the Tulsa Symphony (TSO), leading it in performances of Requiems by Mozart, Brahms,

In a career spanning more than six decades, John Williams has become one of America's most accomplished and successful com-

posers for film and the concert stage. He remains one of our nation's most distinguished and contributive musical voices. He has composed the music for more than one hundred films, including all nine Star Wars films, the first three Harry Potter films, Schindler's List, E.T. the Extra-Terrestrial, Jaws, Jurassic Park, Saving Private Ryan, Lincoln, Close Encounters of the Third Kind, Superman and the Indiana Jones films. He served as music director of the Boston Pops Orchestra for fourteen seasons and remains their Laureate Conductor. He has composed numerous works for the concert stage including two symphonies and more than a dozen concertos commissioned by some of America's most prominent orchestras. He has received five Academy Awards and fifty-four Oscar nominations, seven British Academy Awards, twenty-six Grammys, four Golden Globes, and five Emmys. His other honors include the Kennedy Center Honors, the National Medal of Arts, an honorary KBE from Queen Elizabeth II, the Life Achievement Award from the American Film Institute, Spain's Princess of Asturias Award for the Arts, and the Gold Medal from the UK's prestigious Royal Philharmonic Society.

THE ORCHESTRA NOW



Founded in 2015 by Bard College and led by Leon Botstein, TŌN is a graduate program that is training the next generation of music professionals. It offers young musicians a fulltuition fellowship toward a master's degree or an advanced certificate. TŌN's curriculum combines rehearsal, performance, recording, and touring with seminars, masterclasses, professional development workshops, teaching, and more. The members of the orchestra are graduates of the world's leading conservatories, and hail from countries across North and South America, Europe, and Asia. Many have gone onto have successful careers in orchestras around the world.

TŌN performs dozens of concerts a year at venues including Carnegie Hall, Lincoln Center, The Metropolitan Museum of Art, and the Fisher Center at Bard. In 2025, TŌN performed two concerts in Koblenz and Nuremberg, Germany marking 80 years since the surrender of Nazi Germany. In 2023, TŌN appeared in the Academy Award-nominated film Maestro, and was featured on the Grammy-winning Deutsche Grammophon soundtrack, conducted by Yannick Nézet-Séguin. The orchestra has performed with numerous distinguished guest conductors and soloists, including Leonard Slatkin, Gil Shaham, Neeme Järvi, Stephanie Blythe, Fabio Luisi, Vadim Repin, Joseph Young, Peter Serkin, Naomi Woo, Peter Moore, Tan Dun, and JoAnn Falletta.

Among TŌN's many albums on the Hyperion, Sorel Classics, and AVIE labels are 2024's Exodus and The Lost Generation, and rare recordings of Othmar Schoeck's Lebendig begraben and Bristow's Arcadian Symphony. Fall 2025 releases include Premieres with violinist Gil Shaham and Transcription as Translation. Recordings of TŌN's live concerts from the Fisher Center can be heard regularly on Classical WMHT-FM and WWFM The Classical Network, and the orchestra has appeared over 100 times on Performance Today, broadcast nationwide.
